

See Beyond the Lightsaber at Chetrit's 135 West 52nd Street

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No longer the beleaguered Flatotel, 135 West 52nd Street is attempting to remake itself as the "affordable luxury" home-base of Midtown (undoubtedly the only with a glowing facade installation akin to a gigantic lightsaber). If 52nd Street between Sixth and Seventh avenues seems like a weird location for a new relatively high-end residential building, it is; at least right now. Representatives of 135 are quick to say that Midtown is a new frontier: the Baccarat Hotel & Residences rise nearby, as does COOKFOX's limestone-sheathed creation at 301 East 50th Street. But at this moment, 135 East 52nd Street has a head-start on the Midtown market, and its 40-percent sold status proves it.



The **Rafael Viñoly-designed building** was purchased by the Chetrit Group and Clipper Equity, and is in the midsts of a total renovation by CetraRuddy. The refurbished building will offer **109 apartments**, many of them being purchased as pied-à-terres, ranging in size from one- to five-bedrooms at the cost of \$1.5 million to a bit over \$15 million.



The sales gallery's pièce de résistance is the "levitating" platform with a built-out version of a not-to-scale apartment that showcases the building's fixtures and finishes.







The built-out apartment makes good use of the building's Rimadesio sliding panel doors.
